BYLAWS

The following changes were proposed and approved during the 1967-68 year for Bylaw changes. In drawing up the new printing of the 1968-69 yearbook, these changes should be incorporated in the printing.

- ITEM #1 That the heading "Article I" be added.
- ITEM #2 Article I, Section 1 - The complete section to be printed as follows:
 This organization shall be known as the Philadelphia Chapter of the American Foundrymen's Society.

 (For identification throughout these Bylaw's whenever the word "Chapter" is used, it is meant to refer to the "Philadelphia Chapter of the American Foundrymen's Society". Whenever the word "Society" is used, it is meant to refer to the "National Organization of the Foundrymen's Society.")
- ITEM #3 Article 9, Section 3 under "Membership Committee". The complete section to be printed as follows under sub-heading.
 Membership Committee
 It shall be the responsibility of the Membership Committee to obtain and retain suitable members. At chapter meetings it shall also be their responsibility to assist new members to get acquainted with other members of the chapter.

We also recommend that our Secretary give consideration to writing the Bylaw's Committee of the A.F.S. National that under Article I Section 2 the quotation, "The exclusive object of this chapter shall be, through research and education, to advance the arts and sciences relating to the manufacturing and utilization of metal castings" be changed as follows.

"The exclusive object of this chapter shall be through research and education, to advance the arts, and sciences relating to the engineering, manufacturing and utilization of metal castings.
